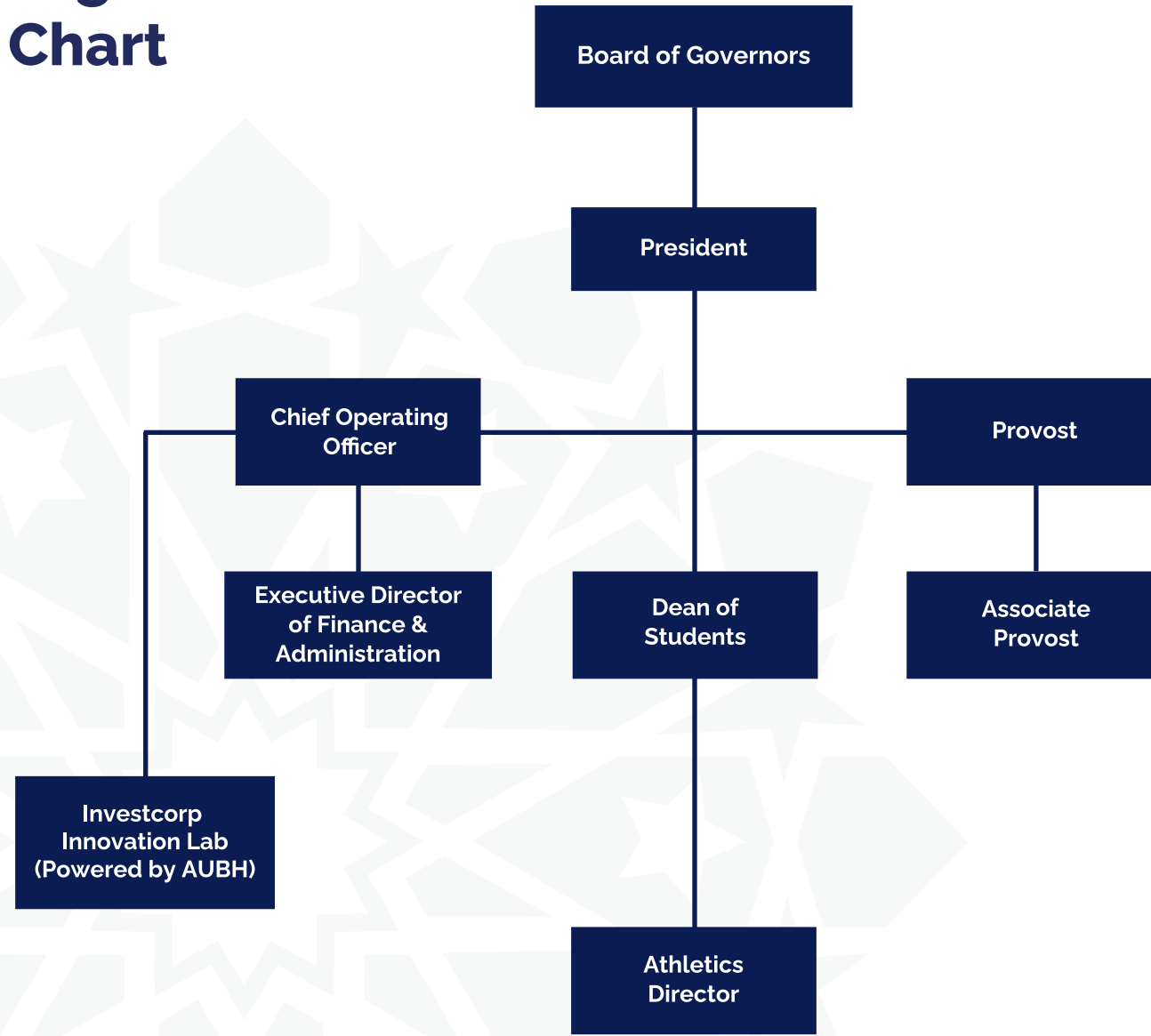

Organizational Chart

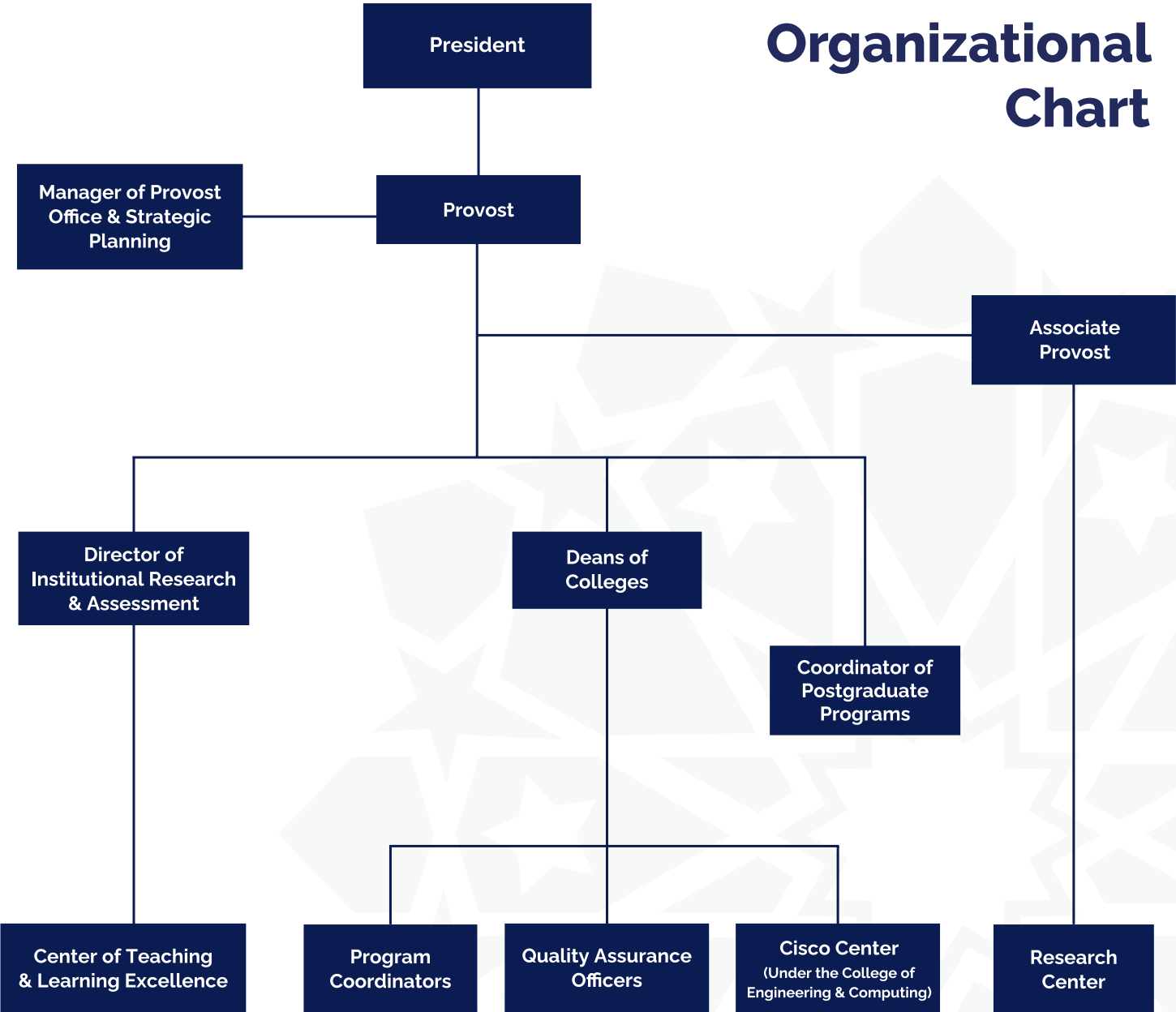

AUBH Centers



Center for Teaching & Learning Excellence (CTLE)

In the academic year 2024–2025, the Center for Teaching and Learning Excellence (CTLE) played a central role in promoting innovative, inclusive, and research-informed teaching practices. Operating under the Associate Provost, CTLE delivered 12 professional development activities, including workshops, webinars, and community forums. Highlights included a two-part National Qualifications Framework (NQF) training, a workshop on inclusive teaching for autistic students in collaboration with Advance HE–UK, and a session on integrating generative AI into education.

A major highlight was Education Day 2025, which drew 108 participants, becoming the most attended CTLE event and fostering dialogue on community-engaged learning. Additionally, CTLE supported faculty development through Coursera course enrollment, promoting flexible and personalized professional learning.

CTLE also led two university-wide research projects. The first evaluated the impact of five innovative pedagogies—PBL, PJBL, flipped classrooms, simulations, and RBL—and found strong alignment between practice and institutional goals. The second assessed AI integration in teaching, revealing promising usage trends and recommending expanded training and student literacy efforts.

Key Achievements

- Delivered 12 PD activities with an average attendance of 30 participants per session.
- Organized Education Day 2025, AUBH's largest CTLE event with 108 attendees.
- Initiated two major pedagogical research studies on innovative teaching and AI in education.
- Strengthened partnerships with the "Arab Consortium for Teaching and Learning Centers" (ACTLC) and Advance HE–UK, enhancing AUBH's regional and global visibility.
- Supported faculty professional growth through access to Coursera courses.



Research Center

AUBH Research Center experienced significant growth and impact in the academic year 2024-2025. The faculty size nearly doubled, leading to a remarkable increase in Scopus-indexed research publications—far surpassing initial targets. Key events like the Annual Research Day and Sustain Bahrain 2025 conference highlighted AUBH's commitment to innovation and interdisciplinary collaboration. Despite logistical and administrative challenges, the Center successfully advanced its research agenda with strategic initiatives planned, including boosting high-quality publications, increasing student research involvement, and launching an institutional peer-reviewed journal.

Key Achievements in Research Output Growth

- Publications increased from 8 (2023-24) to 35 Scopus-indexed papers (2024-25), a **337.5% increase against a 33% target**.
- Expansion of research-active faculty from 23 to 45 members.
- High representation across Q1-Q4 Scopus journals and conferences.

Successful Major Events

- 4th Annual Research Day with **198 attendees and 93% satisfaction rate**.
- Sustain Bahrain 2025 International Conference transitioned online, **attracting 101 attendees** from 21 countries and **92% satisfaction rate**.
- **Awarded Best Paper Prize** and provided Scopus-indexed publication opportunities at the conference.

Strategic Initiatives

- Development and submission of **key institutional policies** (Patent, Compensation for Research Output, External Grants).
- Enhanced faculty research support and targeted incentives.
- Plans for increased interdisciplinary collaboration and research visibility.

Career Center

The Career Center at AUBH is dedicated to empowering students and graduates by providing essential career services that enhance employment and internship opportunities. It offers personalized career counseling, resume and cover letter reviews, and mock interviews to prepare students for the job market. During Summer 2024, the center supported 73 internships—including seven international placements in Switzerland, UAE, and Saudi Arabia. Additionally, the center delivered one-on-one counseling, career coaching workshops, and the Career Boost Program, which offers free certified online courses accessed by over 80 students. Through these efforts, the Career Center actively supports students' professional development and successful transitions into the workforce.

Events & Activities

- Organized 18 career-focused events: workshops, seminars, panel discussions, and field trips.
- **Major highlight:** Career Fair 2025 with 70–80 attendees, 32 companies, and 168 pre-scheduled interviews.
- Other key events included case competitions, HR Talks, virtual info sessions, and sports networking days.
- Hosted industry site visits for engineering and computing students.

Student Engagement

- Over 170 individual counseling and CV review sessions conducted.
- Strong participation in Career Boost Program and workshops.

Employer Partnerships

- Maintained 50+ active employer partners across finance, engineering, tech, hospitality, media, oil & gas, and telecom sectors.
- Collaborations with notable organizations such as Alba, GPIC, Ministry of Works, Investcorp, and Royal Golf Club.
- Facilitated both local and international internships with partners like CERN and ALEASTUR.



Internship & Job Placement

- Facilitated 73 internships in Summer 2024.
- **For 2023–2024 graduates:**
- 52 employed, with 83% employed full-time or in internships related to their field.
- 17% pursuing postgraduate studies.
- Overall, 90% secured successful career destinations within 6 months post-graduation.

Alumni Engagement

- Active job referral programs and direct employment connections.
- Mentorship programs linking alumni with industry professionals.
- Support for internship-to-job transitions.
- Continuous career development support through networking and job updates.
- Established second batch of Alumni Association Executive Board to foster engagement.

- Regular workshops on CV building and design using Canva, including one-on-one coaching.

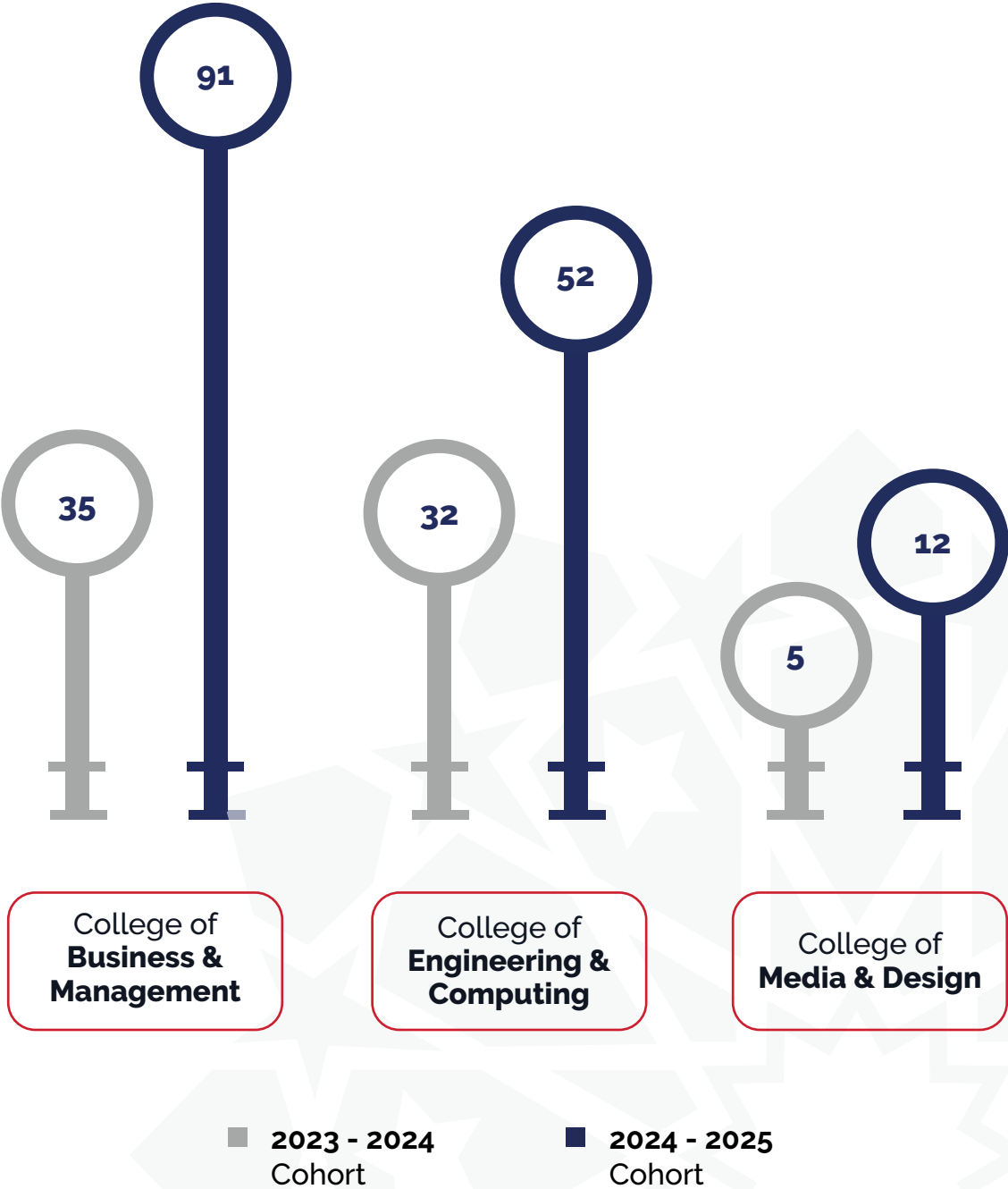


Student & Staff Statistics

Students' Total Enrollment

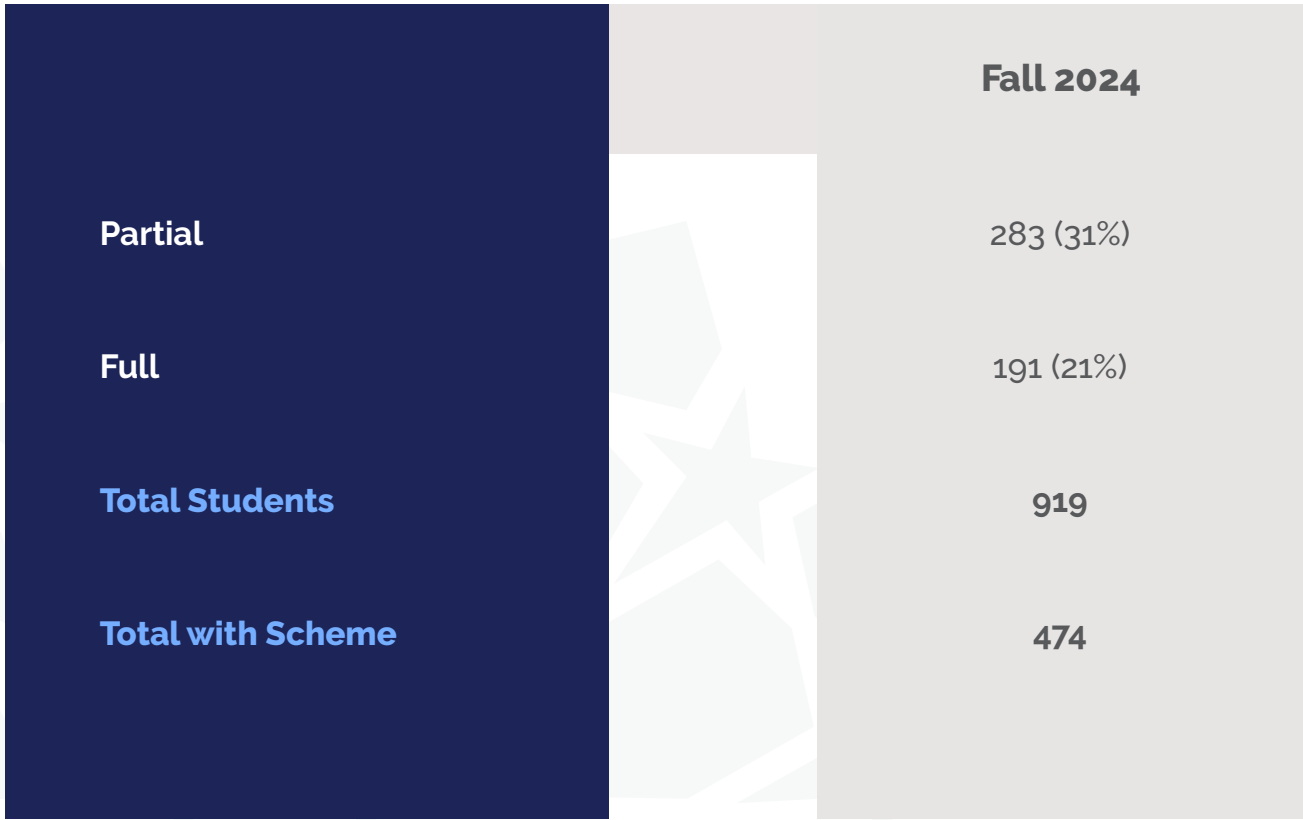


Graduates per College

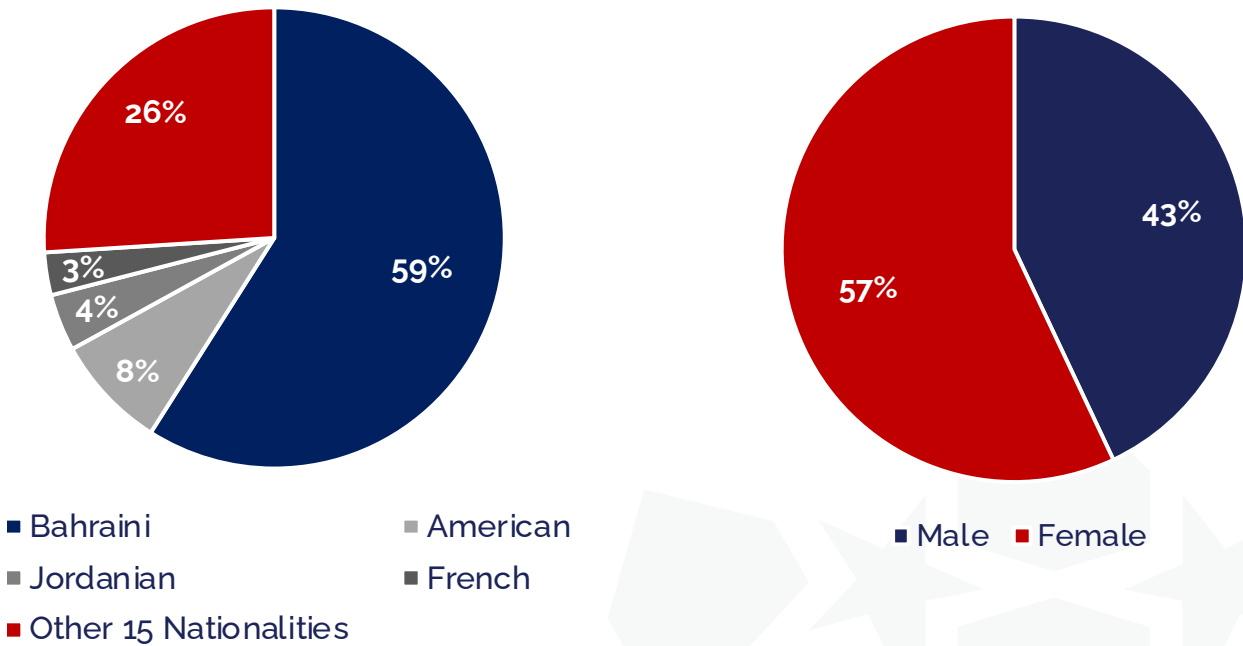

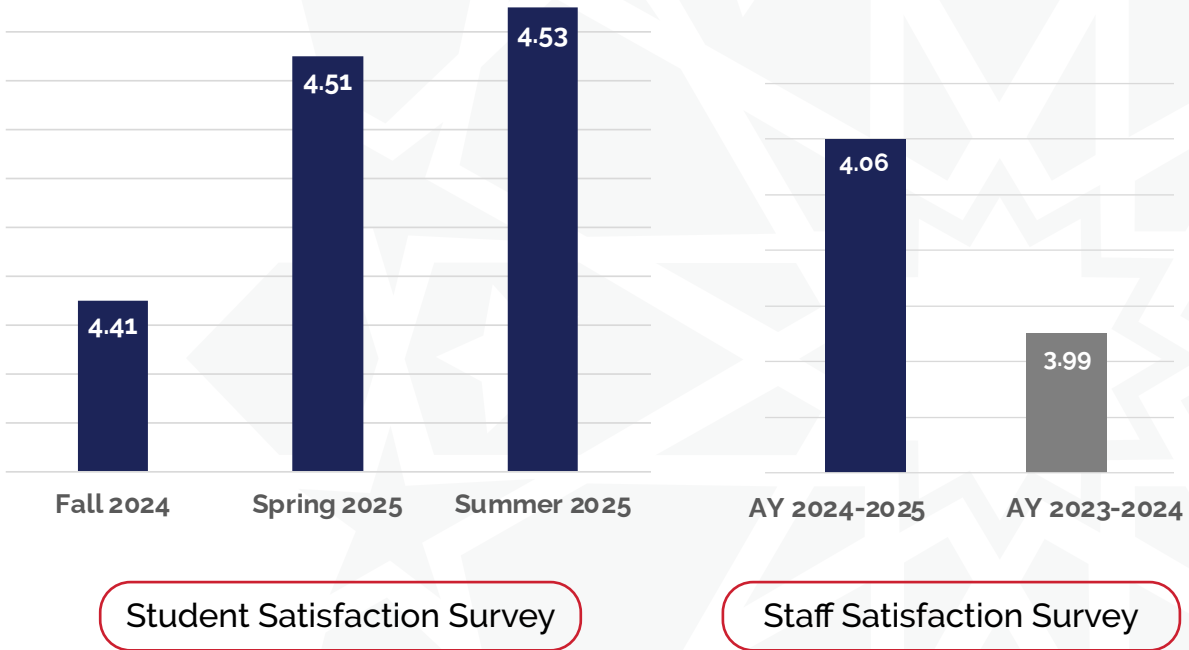
